| | Fences, gates, and benches were found in reasonable condition. Perimeter hedges and shrubs were observed tidy and not overgrown. Grass is at a suitable height. Footpath surfaces remain slippery in places. Pathways are well demarcated across the orchard (Photo 1). Waymarkers are in place. Allotment activity increasing as Spring approaches. Generally, good housekeeping is being observed by plot holders. |

| ISSUES TO REPORT | User information signage was in situ and legible at both playgrounds. As previously reported, a new sign is required at Tring Station playground to notify visitors that the facility is managed/maintained by APC. The following issues were found at Tring Station playground: Plastic steering wheel needs refixing on the play train (Photo 2). Very loose. Rotting soft timber is evident on a climbing frame (Photo 3),. Clerk informed. APC may want Wildwood (manufacturer/installer) to inspect. Grass has recently been mowed at both playgrounds. On immediately entering the Aldbury Playground, the ground is worn/bare and can become slippery after heavy rainfall. APC may wish to arrange repair i.e. reseeding/turfing. Litter bin at Aldbury Playground was emptied on the 25th of March. Fences remain in reasonable condition. Entrance gates were operating properly at both playgrounds. |

| ISSUES TO REPORT | All streetlamps were found in working order during the evening of the 9th of March. Litter picking was completed throughout the village, including Stocks Road (to the walled garden), New Ground Road (to the former isolation hospital), Station Road (to the Church Farm entrance), Malting Lane, Stonycroft and Toms Hill. Toms Hill drain work has been undertaken by Ringway. A replacement pipe has been installed most of the way down Toms Hill to the Peace Hall. New manhole covers are in place (Photos 5, 6 7 and 8). HCC informed that blocked drains/gullies in Malting Lane (x 2), Station Road (opposite the church) and Stocks Road (near Applegarth) have been added to the HCC annual drain unblocking programme. Ref No's 401003990129, 401003990131, 401003990125 and 401003990137 respectively. HCC have inspected a sunken drain near the Church Farm entrance and decided that it currently does not warrant repair (Photo 9). Ref No: 401003990133. Several well used public footpaths continue to prove tricky for walkers, notably by gates, where surfaces can become worn and waterlogged (Photo 10). Three large potholes in New Ground Road have been reported to HCC following concerns expressed by several local motorists. (Photo 11). Ref No: 401004060877. Outstanding Items Fallen tree is lying in a drainage ditch (south of Stonycroft). Landowner was notified. The Clerk will chase it up. Reinstatement of missing road markings. at the New Ground Road/Stonycroft Junction. Ref No: 401003875518. |
